Margie grew up in the Los Angeles area and graduated from La Puente High School in 1965. She met her first husband, John Movsesian in 1969. They married July 17th, 1971. They had their first child John, in 1973. Within a few years, John and Margie moved to Kingsburg, John pursued farming and Margie was a homemaker. Later, the couple had three more sons. Vince was born in 1976, Joey in 1979, and Steven in 1980. Margie always wanted a girl but was thankful to have four boys. Once the boys were older, Margie worked as an insurance agent. She was in the insurance business for approximately 20 years. She was well known in Kingsburg and had many friends.

Words to describe Margie are loving, loyal, caring, bubbly and persistent. Shopping was one of her hobbies and she always enjoyed getting her hair and nails done. She was fond of the color purple and cheetah print clothing. Margie was strong in her Catholic faith and frequently attended mass. Due to the loss of her husband John (brain cancer), Margie became involved with the Cancer Foundation. John and Margie were married 20 years. In 2000, Margie married Chris Peacock. They were married for 23 years. Margie was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, and sister.

On September 18, 2023, Margie passed away. She is survived by her husband Chris, her four sons, her grandchildren (Macie, Madelyn, Malorie, Sophia, Eliana, Evelyn, Vivian, and Hudson), and sister Pam Kreiling. Margie will be missed by her family and friends.
